**I Stand by the Door
By Sam Shoemaker**

I stand by the door.
I neither go too far in, nor stay too far out.

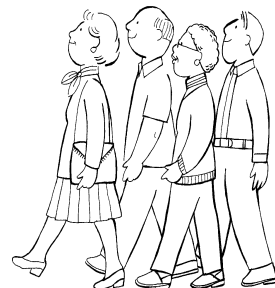

New at Saraland UMC... Celebrate Recovery

Celebrate Recovery is for anyone that has a hurt, hang up or habit they would like to move out of the center of their life. Many unfamiliar with the program view it as something for those with drug and alcohol addictions. It is much more than that! Think about all of the things that can affect your life in a negative way. Things like: eating, video games, television, pornography, shopping, sex, codependency, abuse, smoking, anger, control, depression, pride, insecurity, abandonment, drugs, alcohol, etc. When you really think about it, we all have something in our life we need to work on! There are times when we all could use a little of what Celebrate Recovery offers.

In the beginning, AA meetings were held in the back rooms and basements of buildings. When Celebrate Recovery first started, it's purpose was to remove the stigmatism from "those people" and help everyone understand that alcohol may be someone else's problem, but we all have something we need help with at some point in our life. The average age of an addict's first use is now 11 years old. A recent statistic stated that almost 1/3 of Americans are currently addicted to something. Think about how many people we know that are raising their grandchildren because of addictions.

Our launch date is September 8. Meetings will begin at 6:30 p.m. Celebrate Recovery will meet every Tuesday, holiday or otherwise. We will start out with four groups: men with chemical addictions, women with chemical addictions, men with codependency and women with codependency. Currently, we have nine people that have agreed to help with this program but we need at least twelve. We need people that will help with serving meals and cleaning up. We desperately need individuals to facilitate a small group that are willing to admit that at some point in the past they were addicted to drugs and/or alcohol and have been sober for more than one year. To quote John Baker, one of the founders of Celebrate Recovery, "Hurt people hurt people while restored people restore people." Celebrate Recovery is about helping people find restoration through God while working with others.

The other founder of Celebrate Recovery is Rick Warren of Saddleback Church, author of the Purpose Driven Life. Pastor Rick provided this information concerning Celebrate Recovery:

"The Bible clearly states "all have sinned." It is my nature to sin, and it is yours too. None of us is untainted. Because of sin, we've

all hurt ourselves, we've all hurt other people, and others have hurt us. This means each of us need repentance and recovery in order to live our lives the way God intended. You've undoubtedly heard the expression that "time heals all wounds." Unfortunately, it isn't true. As a pastor, I frequently talk with people who are still carrying hurts from 30 or 40 years ago. The truth is - time often makes things worse. Wounds that are left untended fester and spread infection throughout your entire body. Time only extends the pain if the problem isn't dealt with.

What we need is a biblical and balanced program to help people overcome their hurts, habits and hang-ups. Celebrate Recovery is that program. Based on the actual words of Jesus rather than psychological theory, our recovery program is unique, and more effective in helping people change than anything else I've seen or heard of. Over the years I've witnessed how the Holy Spirit has used this program to transform literally thousands of lives at Saddleback Church and help people grow toward full Christlike maturity.

Most people are familiar with the classic 12 step program of A.A. and other groups. While undoubtedly many lives have been helped through the twelve steps, I've always been uncomfortable with that program's vagueness about the nature of God, the saving power of Jesus Christ, and the ministry of the Holy Spirit. So I began an intense study of the Scriptures to discover what God had to say about "recovery." To my amazement, I found the principles of recovery, and even their logical order, given by Christ in his most famous message, the Sermon on the Mount. My study resulted in a ten-week series of messages called "The Road to Recovery." During that series, my Associate Pastor John Baker developed the workbooks, which became the heart of our Celebrate Recovery program. I believe that this program is unlike any recovery program you may have seen. There are seven features that make it unique:

- This recovery program is based on God's Word, the Bible...
This recovery program is forward-looking...
This recovery program emphasizes personal responsibility...
This recovery program emphasized spiritual commitment to Jesus Christ...
This recovery program utilizes the biblical truth that we need each other in order to grow spiritually and emotionally...
This recovery program addresses all types of habits, hurts and hang-ups...
Finally, this recovery program produces lay ministers!

In closing, let me say that the size of your church is no barrier to beginning a Celebrate Recovery ministry. You can start it with just a small group of people and watch it grow by word-of-mouth. Your won't be able to keep it a secret for long! You are going to see lives changed in dramatic ways. You are going to see hopeless marriages restored and people set free from all kinds of sinful habits, hang-ups, and hurts as they allow Jesus to be Lord in every area of their lives. To God be the glory! We'll be praying for you.
